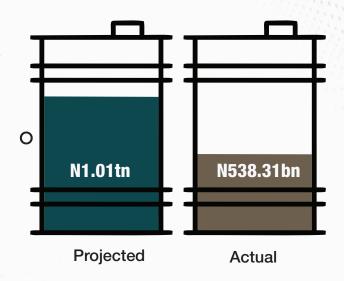

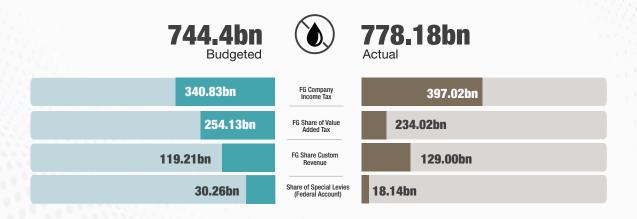




FG's Share of Non-Oil Revenue

FG share from Stamp Duties as at June 30th, 2021 was recorded as Zero out of the projected **N250bn** for the first half of the year. Also, FG did not earn anything from Domestic Recoveries + Assets + Fines out of the projected N16.34bn for the first half of the year. FG is either making unrealisitic revenue projections for this line item or there is need for more accountability in the collection of these revenue line items.

Total Expenditure

FG spent a total of

N5.81tn

representing 100.86% of the N5.76tn half-year budget as at June 30th, 2021. This comprises, N2.02tn spent on Recurrent Expenditure (Debt Servicing) while N3.78tn was spent on non-debt expenditure.

The N3.78tn is further broken down into

N2.23tn

spent on Non-Debt Recurrent Expenditure, N1.30tn on Capital Expenditure and N248.26bn on Statutory Transfers.

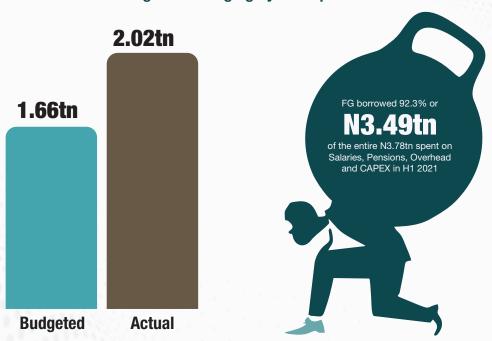

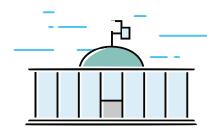
