Corruption Perceptions Index 2023

\$18 billion

Nigeria's anti-corruption agencies estimate that \$18 billion is lost to corruption and financial crimes from the country's total annual spend on public procurement;



The Nigeria Extractive Industries Transparency Initiative reported that Nigeria lost

in oil revenues between 2011 and 2019 due to corruption and mismanagement:

\$200 billion

Estimates point to various worrying figures. It is been suggested that between 1970 and 2008 that Nigeria lost over \$200 billion due to corruption and procurement irregularities.

Common Red Flags in Capital Projects



Procurement and Contracting

Limited competition, repeated awards to the same firms, lack of transparency



Oversight and Governance

Lack of public information non-compliance with audit recommendations. weak civil society engagement



Financial Irregularities

Contract variations. discrepancies between approved and actual costs, unjustified advance payments



Low Civil Society Involvement

Near exclusion of all component of the civil society in project conceptualization and delivery framework



Implementation and Delivery

Abandoned or delayed projects, poor quality of infrastructure excessive subcontracting













Governance Criteria for Capital Projects Tracking

Clarity of Roles



MDAs, anti-corruption agencies, legislatures, CSOs, media, and citizens must have clearly defined roles withing monitoring framework

Conflict of Interest Management



The legal and policy frames around disclosure, independent oversight, recusal, and penalties for breaches must be clear

Financial and Administrative Requirements



Robust tracking systems, regular reporting, independent audits, and timely fund release














Reporting Channels for Corruption and Mismanagement in Capital Projects

First-level resolution (project oversight committees).

Reporting Channels for Corruption and Mismanagement in Capital Projects



Legislative and judicial oversight



Regular audits, quarterly/annual reports, and systemic reforms













CSO/Media Guide to Capital Project Monitoring



monitor needs assessment, feasibility studies, and procurement planning.



Ensure transparency in bidding, evaluation, and contract signing.



Track progress, financial management, and compliance with technical specifications.



Verify project completion, conduct final audits, and ensure proper handover.
